



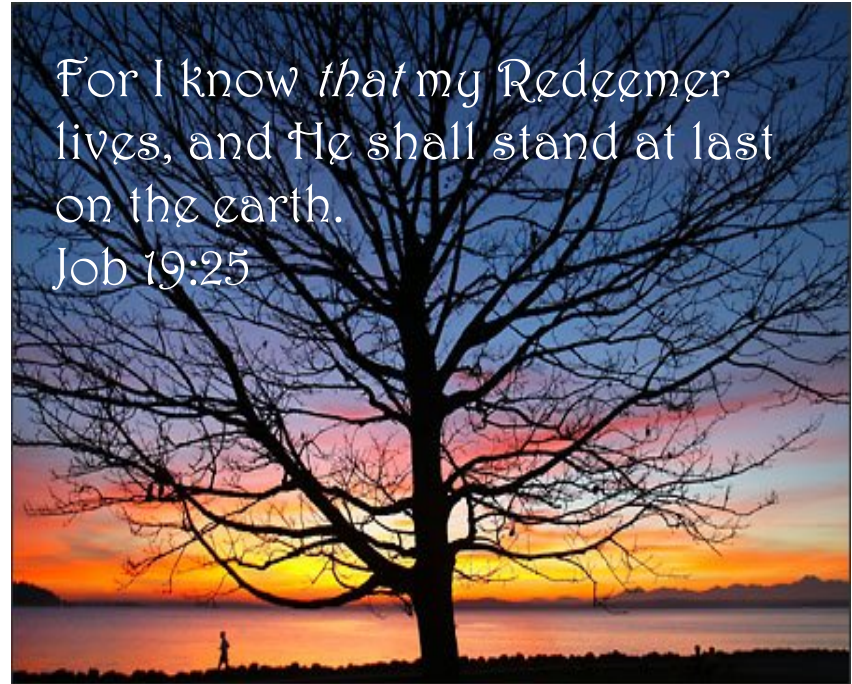

All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work. (2 Ti 3:16-17)

Job-

It is usually said that the book of Job deals with this question: “Why do the godly suffer?” Actually, the theme goes deeper than that. Satan accused Job of serving God only because God blessed him. Unfortunately, there are people like that, people with “commercial faith” who say to God, “If you bless me, I will serve You!” (See Satan’s temptation of Christ in Matt. 4:8–10.)

The basic question is not “Why do the righteous suffer?” (there are many answers to that question) but “Is our God worthy of our worship and service, or must He ‘buy’ us with His blessings?” Satan was not only slandering Job; he was also slandering the Lord! He was saying, “God would not have any followers if He did not reward them!”

Passage for today: Job 21

Questions to Ponder

1. What is the main thrust of Job's words toward his three comforters in this chapter? What might we learn from his words?
2. One of the things that Job addresses in this chapter is the seeming prosperity and comfort of the wicked. Take some time to read Psalm 73. What was going on in the heart of Asaph (the writer of the Psalm) that caused him to think that the wicked were prospering while he, being faithful to God, was being plagued and chastened every morning? What was it that happened in Asaph's heart that caused him to see the eternal truth regarding the wicked (See Psalm 73:17)? How is this Psalm similar to what we see here in Job 21? What can we learn from these passages concerning God's ultimate plan for the wicked and for those who are truly His?
3. Today, have you visited "the sanctuary of God" (Psalm 73:17) to come to the understanding of God's truth concerning the wicked and the righteous? Explain.
