Ephesians 6:10-24

EPHESIANS 6

Spirit-filled Christians will manifest Christlikeness in the home (vv.1–4), on the job (vv. 5–9), and on the battlefield (vv. 10–20). If we do not learn to obey at home, we are not likely to be obedient on the job or in the army of the Lord. Likewise, if we have not learned to *take* orders, we will not be too successful at *giving* orders, either as parents or as employers.

The danger in the home is parents who are *authoritarian* but do not exercise loving spiritual *authority*. The danger on the job is the employee who is a clock-watcher and does not obey from the heart, and the “boss” who forgets that he is second in command and will one day give an account to the Lord.

The danger on the battlefield is that we do not take the enemy seriously and therefore fail to put on all of the armor. By faith, you put on the armor through prayer, which must be done at the beginning of every day. Never underestimate the strategy and strength of the devil.

Study Questions for Ephesians 6:10-24

1. How is one made “strong in the Lord”? What does Paul mean by “the full armor”? Why does Paul give such a command to believers? What reminder does Paul give of the kind of war being waged? How often are you aware of the spiritual battle going on behind the scenes? How does it change your perspective to remember that your struggle is not with other people?

2. Identify and define each piece of spiritual armor. Whose responsibility is it to put the armor on? Is it possible to “put on” only part of the armor? Are there any ways in which you have not put on these pieces of armor? Which one do you struggle most with?

3. What lessons can we draw from Satan’s use of “fiery arrows”? How is our knowledge of God’s word important in this battle? How did Christ use “the sword” in the temptation by Satan?

4. What three elements are included in Paul’s closing benediction? Explain the importance of each one. What other element is included here? Who are the recipients of these blessings?
